Under NFPA 660:2025, the requirements from two formerly separate standards, NFPA 664 (focused on wood processing and woodworking facilities) and NFPA 654 (covering a wide range of combustible dust applications not addressed by other standards) are now consolidated. By understanding and adhering to these essential requirements, businesses can create a safer, rolling exposure to respirable crystalline silica. Specifically, this sheet provides advice on the design of dust extraction unit ly appropriate protection and prevention measures. Industrial dust collection systems or the air pollution control equipment (APC) can be broadly classified as - Fabric filters, Inertial separators, and Electrostatic precipitators. A system for removing contaminated air from a space, comprising two or more of the following elements enclosure or hood, duct work, dust. Whenever hazardous substances such as dusts, fumes, mists, vapors, or gases exist or are produced in the course of construction work, their concentrations shall not exceed the limits specified in § 1926.
