

Strong and weak current cables run together in the same conduit



Overview

The national standard GB50303 clearly stipulates: It is strictly forbidden to lay strong and weak power cables in the same pipe, the parallel spacing must be $\geq 300\text{mm}$, and the angle should be $\geq 60^\circ$ when crossing to reduce coupling interference. Strong current cables carry high voltage and high current of 220V and above, and are responsible for driving power equipment such as lighting and air conditioning; while weak current cables transmit voice, data and control signals below 36V, building information channels for smart homes and.
