A fiber-optic sensor is a sensor that uses optical fiber either as the sensing element ("intrinsic sensors"), or as a means of relaying signals from a remote sensor to the electronics that process the signals ("extrinsic sensors"). Fibers have many uses in remote sensing. Radiation absorption creates electronic excited states that are trapped by localized defects for extended periods of time. Fiber optic sensors play a key role in developing the communication system to sense & measure the change within. A sensor is a device that measures a physical quantity and converts it into a signal. In essence, a sensor reacts to a physical, chemical, or biological condition.
