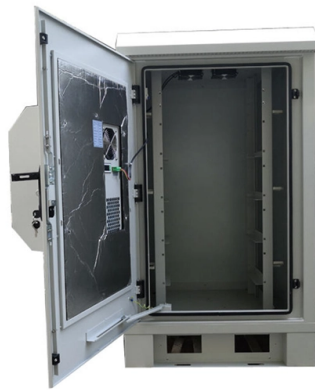


Where is the fiber distribution box usually located in a home
